21	Drowning		 When the boat is operating and when they are outside the boat cabin and cockpit:- 1. Buoyancy aids must be worn by all passengers under the age of 16. 2. Buoyancy aids will be recommended to be worn by all users of the boat aged 16 and above and by all group leaders. 3. Buoyancy aids must be worn by skipper and crew. 4. Buoyancy aids must be fully checked each month by the Skipper and a record kept, including gas cylinder expiry dates. Crew member to carry out a visual check of their buoyancy aid before each use. (Visible signs of wear including straps).
